

THE JANE HURSHMAN-CORKUM ENDOWED BURSARY

Application Deadline: November 6, 2009

This bursary was initiated by the Mount's Women's Studies Society in recognition of the life of Jane Hurshman-Corkum (1949-1992). The bursary fund recognizes the obstacles to be surmounted by survivors of violence and the many supports needed to build new directions. The bursary will assist female students who are survivors of violence and in need of financial support.

In addition to submitting the usual bursary form, applicants must submit a 'support statement' which is overleaf.

This 'supporter statement' may be signed by anyone the applicant chooses to ask who has played a supporter role to the applicant and may include, but not be limited to, such people as a personal friend, relative, minister, doctor, transition house worker, lawyer, court worker, social worker, therapist. It is not necessary for applicants to supply any details whatsoever about the nature or extent of their experiences. The purpose of the 'support statement' is solely to verify that the applicant has suffered and survived violence and is, therefore, eligible to be considered for this particular award.
