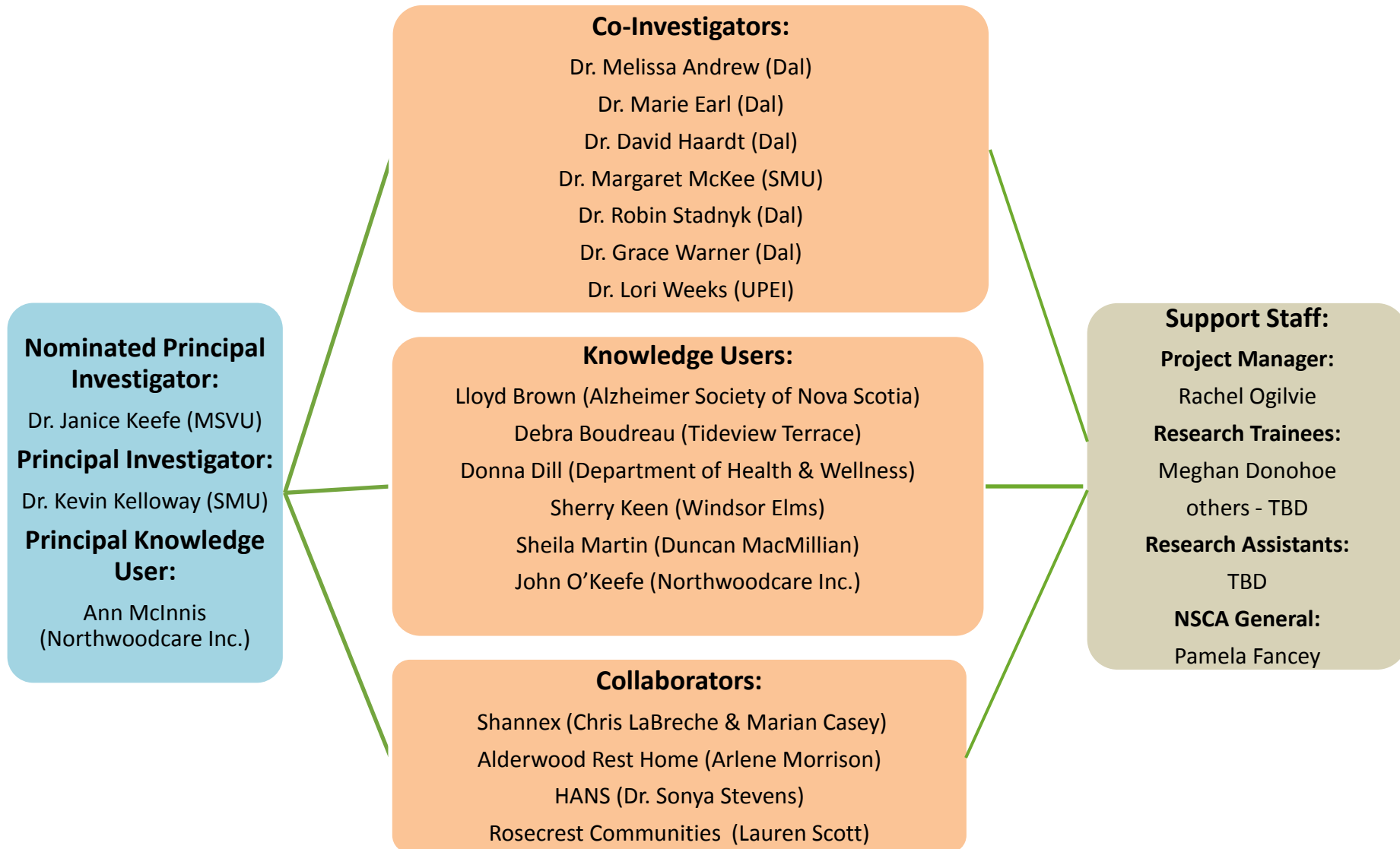

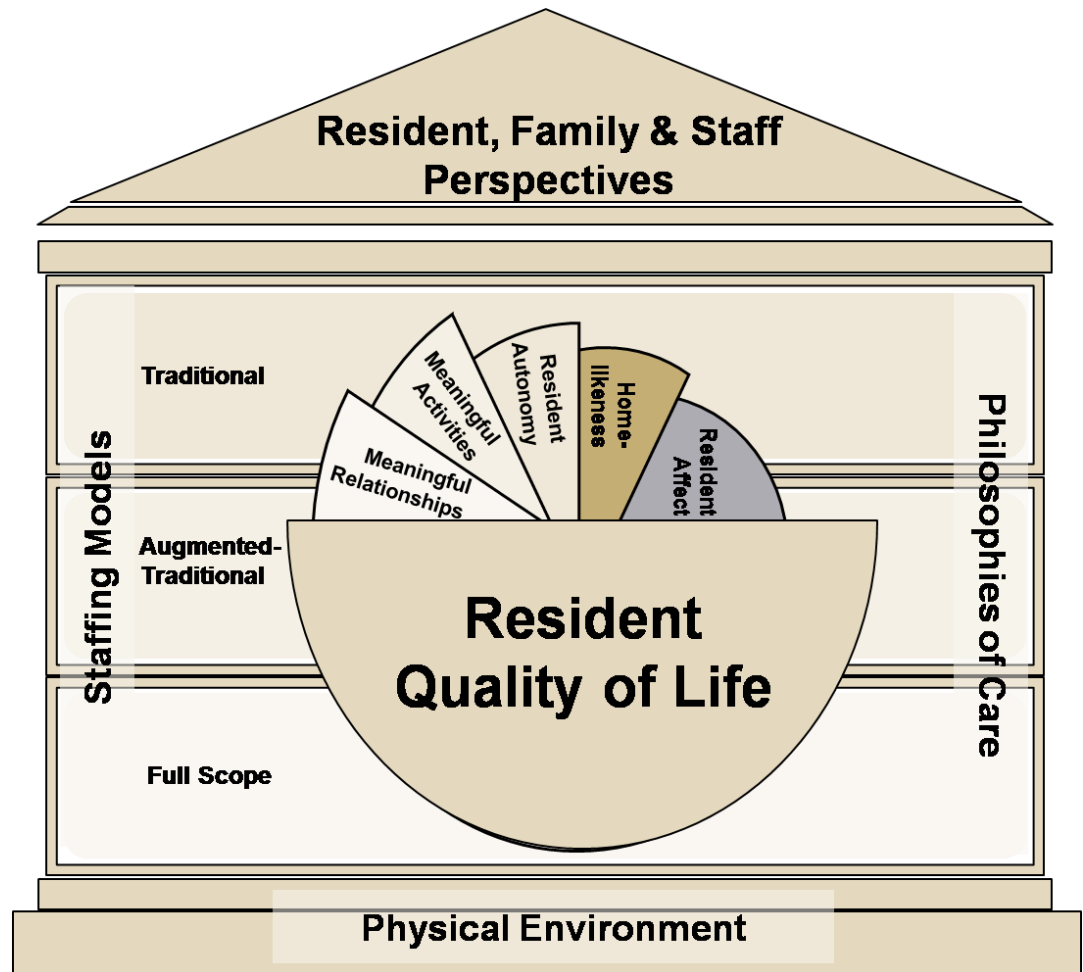

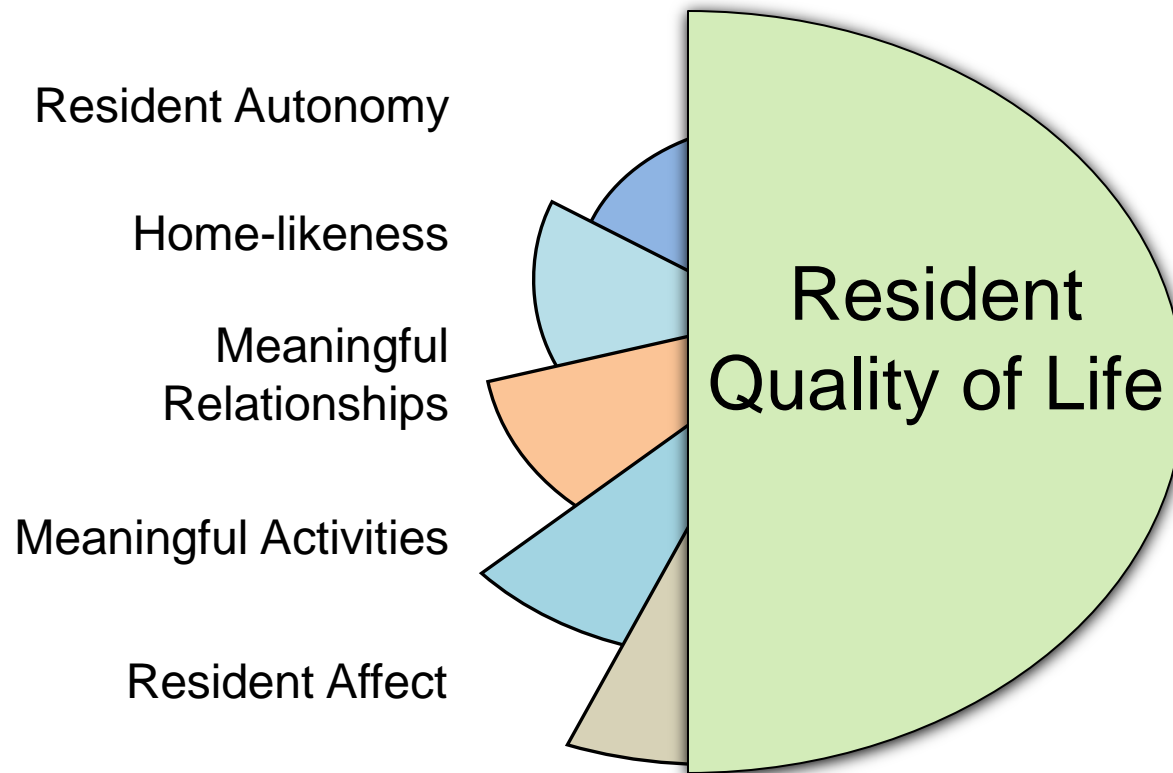

1. To examine resident quality of life through the **residents' experience** with different models of care.



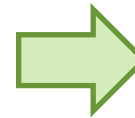
