Project Description:

The project aims to understand how working conditions in long-term care settings may affect the conditions of care of the residents. This project involves a multi-disciplinary, multi-sector team of researchers and sector collaborators including provincial ministries, health authorities, associations and long-term care providers. Project activities include the administration of a survey to staff in care homes in Atlantic Canada to assess quality of work life, analysis of resident assessment information and sector engagement activities to increase research capacity and enhance ongoing collaborations on long-term care within Atlantic Canada.

This position reports to the Centre's Director and project's Principal Investigator, Dr. Janice Keefe.

The Research Project Manager provides operational oversight and overall coordination of the implementation of the project across the four provinces. The duties of the position include:

- Develop work plans and identify project milestones, critical success factors and risk mitigation strategies
- Develop protocols for study implementation and quality assurance processes
- Financial management including inter-university funding agreements
- Support staff hiring and training and supervise staff
- Plan, prepare and organize team meetings and knowledge translation/exchange events
- Prepare study documents (e.g., ethics applications, data agreements, service contracts, funder reports) and maintain project records
- Liaise with project leads and research site managers, TREC personnel, HRDR Data Unit, vendors and study sites
- Maintain communications with team and foster team engagement
- Prepare communications for promotions and recruitment of study participants
- Support development of study deliverables

About You

A Master's degree in a health or social sciences discipline with minimum of the equivalent of three years full time of demonstrated research project management experience in a university setting. Specific requirements include:

- Research project management with multi-site project.
- Superior planning, organizational, and management skills.
- High regard for quality and attention to detail.
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills.
- Experience supervising staff and providing direction and support to trainees.
- A team player with ability to work independently while demonstrating initiative.
- Event planning experience.
- High skill level with technology (i.e., Microsoft Office Suite).
- Demonstrated experience writing for various audiences.
- Background in gerontology and/or familiarity with issues related to continuing care industry preferred.
