Curriculum Resource Centre / Lending Library

Our Curriculum Resource Centre (CRC) is located in Seton Academic Centre and serves primarily Education and Child and Youth Study students at the Mount. Inclusion Strategies for Preschoolers with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)-Introduction

Date: Saturday March 20 9am—12 noon **AND** Tuesday March 30, 2021 6:30 pm—9 pm **Cost:** \$65 **Total PD hours:** 5.5 hours **Location:** Online Presenters: Heather Hiscock & Debbie Thompson

Description: This two-part session will guide participants through an introduction to how Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) can present in different children, how to use information from observations to make adaptations to help engage and motivate children, particularly those who may not be motivated by the same materials as peers or who resist participating in various routines. We will examine our own attitudes toward inclusion and how those attitudes influence the culture of the entire classroom. We will also discuss the typical, current process for diagnosis and intervention for preschool children with ASD in Nova Scotia.

Three main goals 1) to acquire strategies for discovering motivators to engage children with ASD 2)to learn how to use children's interests to adapt materials and routines in the preschool environment.

3) to gain familiarity with the diagnosis and intervention process

Inclusion Strategies for Preschoolers with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)-Advanced

Date: Saturday May 1 9am— 12 noon AND Tuesday May 11, 2021 6:30 pm— 9 pm Cost: \$65 **Total PD hours**: 5.5 hours Location: Online Presenters: Heather Hiscock & Debbie Thompson

Description: Prerequisite: Participants registering for this session must have either taken the *Inclusion Strategies for Preschoolers with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)-Introduction* or have taken some previous introductory or basic ASD training.

This two-part session will build on skills of those who have an understanding of ASD and are comfortable using observations to increase motivation during free play and other routines throughout the day. Participants will be guided through various concrete teaching strategies to build skills in preschoolers with ASD, to reduce undesired behaviours and to facilitate interaction and relationship development with peers.

Three main goals 1) to learn teaching strategies for building communication, play and social skills

- 2) to gain skills on how to develop plans for reducing disruptive behaviours
- 3) to acquire strategies to support peer interactions

Presenter Biographies: *Heather Hiscock* graduated with a Bachelor of Applied Arts (Child & Youth Study) & in the twenty plus years since then, has been working with preschoolers. She has worked as an Early Childhood Educator, one-to-one support staff & as a resource teacher. For five years, she served as Resource Teacher at the Mount's Child Study Centre, supporting all of the children with identified special needs &, in particular, delivering programming to students with Autism Spectrum Disorder. She has developed & facilitated workshops on a variety of topics, most frequently relating to Inclusion. Heather has worked as a Program Implementer in Halifax's Early Intensive Behavioural Intervention program for the past fifteen years.

Debbie Thompson is a graduate from Mount Saint Vincent University with the Degree in Child & Youth. Debbie started her journey in ECE at Wee Care Developmental centre working as a Developmental teacher in an integrated setting. It was there that she knew she wanted to focus her attention on working with children with special needs. Debbie also developed the Resource position at Wee Care & was responsible for developing & implementing plans for children with special needs. Debbie now works at the IWK as a Program Implementer for the Early Intensive Behaviour Intervention program (EIBI) working with children with Autism. Through her job at the IWK she continues to work closely with preschool teachers consulting & providing feedback in various programs. Debbie also teaches regularly at Nova Scotia College of Early Childhood Education & Mount Saint Vincent University on various topics including challenging behaviour & Inclusion.

Empowering Educators Workshop Series

Description:

This workshop will allow new early childhood educators the opportunity to implement their current knowledge and empower the long-term educators to showcase their years of experience and expertise.

As early childhood educators in Nova Scotia begin to implement the Nova Scotia Early Learning Curriculum Framework, it is important to reflect on our current practices. This workshop series will encourage participants to share their current practices and explore new tools and ideas to improve overall quality in their early learning environments.

Session 1 Friday March 26, 2021 Engaging with Young Children and Families 7pm-9pm

Educators will discuss how to create meaningful interactions with children and families in the early childhood setting. Participants will explore strategies to implement throughout the daily routine and discuss effective ways to engage with parents.

Session 2 Friday April 9, 2021- Using Observation Methods to Enhance Program Quality 7pm-9pm

Early childhood educators are responsible to plan daily activities and provide indoor and outdoor environments that meet the needs of all children. This workshop will provide participants with a variety of methods to observe and record important information to help make necessary changes to their early learning environments.

Session 3 Friday April 23, 2021- Setting up the Indoor Learning Environment 7pm-9pm

Setting up enriched activity areas in the early childhood classroom is essential when offering a quality program. This workshop will discuss the important areas of the indoor classroom and how the organization of the areas can impact overall learning. A variety of before and after photos will be showcased to demonstrate how small changes can increase program quality.

Session 4 Friday May 7 Daily Routine and Programming for Young Children 7pm-9pm

All children thrive in environments with consistent daily routines and child led learning opportunities. This workshop will discuss the importance of routines and the impact that consistency has on a young child's social emotional well being. Participants will discuss effective learning practices that take place throughout the day in a play-based learning environment.

Session 5 Friday May 21 Showcase Quality Improvements 7pm-9pm

Throughout the four sessions, participants are encouraged to take information from the workshops and implement changes into their early childhood programs. Participants are invited to this session to showcase the changes and share the impact that it has had on the overall quality of their program.

Presenter Biography: *Kathy Black* has been in the field of Early Childhood Education for over 33 years. In the beginning of Kathy's career, she enjoyed implementing programs for children 4 months – 12 years of age. After 15 years Kathy left the early childhood classroom to take on the role as Early Childhood Development Consultant and Licensing Officer with the Nova Scotia Provincial Government. Kathy began creating and facilitating curriculum workshops to early childhood educators throughout the province in 2005. In 2019 Kathy began another journey as faculty in the Early Childhood Education program at the Nova Scotia Community College. Kathy's purpose in life is to empower others to nurture and guide young children and families.

Conflict Resolution with Caregivers

Description: Dealing with difficult people and having challenging conversations is something most people will encounter. As Early Child Care Workers, you encounter various challenging conversations on a regular basis, leading to additional stressors, both professional personally. Therefore, it's important to have valuable skills to resolve conflict and manage challenging conversations, should they arise. The purpose of this workshop is to support staff to prepare for high-stake conversations with parents and colleagues, addressing concerns early and consistently, before they become significant issues. The purpose is to also discuss workplace dynamics and the importance of self-care.

Presenter Biographies: *Colin Morrison* has over 20 years' experience working with children, youth & families in the mental health field. Colin has served primarily as youth care worker & case coordinator for families & children in the Child & Family Day Treatment Program at the IWK. He has extensive experience in developing & implementing skill groups with children, particularly in the area of emotional regulation, & providing supportive counselling to families. Colin is currently completing a Master of Social Worker degree at Dalhousie University, & is working on a thesis related to male childhood sexual abuse, & the impacts of "toxic masculinity" on mens' help seeking behaviours. He has a keen interest in trauma focused therapy, attachment theory, mens' health, & issues affecting the LGBTQ+ community. *Karen Carey* has over 15 years' experience working with children, youth & families as a social worker, youth care worker, case coordinator, in home support worker & direct care practitioner. Through evidence based & best practice methods, Karen is a strong advocate for the children, youth & families. Although Karen has strong roots in attachment theory, systems theory, positive parenting, trauma & resilience; her personal philosophy is to promote mental, physical & emotional health/wellbeing though a solution focused & social learning model.

Together Colin & Karen have seen positive & long lasting benefits for children AND families when they are provided education, strategies, guidance, empathy & support. They see effective communication & open collaboration as the key ingredients in supporting positive futures for the children & families under their care.

Music and storytelling also provide a wonderful way to represent the vast cultural diversity in our community, and can introduce children to a variety of languages, festivals, and cultural traditions. Join Trena for a fun and interactive day of learning and sharing and leave feeling inspired and ready to incorporate new songs, stories, and activities into the rhythm of the day. Participants will be given an opportunity to practice and rehearse material, and to explore ways to make it their own. 


