


Dr. Emily Ballantyne from MSVU Teaching and Learning Centre outlines both the **benefits** and **risks** of using generative AI in academics.

One of the key advantages she points out is Al's ability to **personalize the learning experience**. Students can utilize Al tools to interact with their study materials in various ways that suit their learning styles and request instant feedback. It can help identify learning gaps, assist with writing and revision, and support preparation for assessments, making it a useful tool when used responsibly.

However, she also warns about the disadvantages and potential risks. Overusing AI can prevent students from developing key academic skills like writing, researching, critical thinking, and information retention. Generative AI tools are also prone to errors, known as "hallucinations", where the tool produces inaccurate or misleading information. She stresses that students must act as fact-checkers and always verify AI-generated information using reliable academic sources like the MSVU Library.

Most importantly, using AI without permission or outside of assignment guidelines can lead to academic integrity violations. Professors don't need AI detectors because they rely on their experience to recognize when something isn't right. Dr. Ballantyne emphasizes that students must follow each professor's specific guidelines, ask questions when unsure, treat AI as a learning partner, and always use it ethically to support your education, not replace your own effort.

Ethical Issues with Generative Al

Inaccuracies and Hallucinations

Al-generated content may contain inaccurate information. Accuracy of Al-generated content can vary widely, depending on the particular tool, its training data, and the prompt provided. Because Al uses probability to generate content, it can provide false information, which is called a hallucination. For example, ChatGPT has been known to create false citations that appear to be real sources, but do not actually exist.

Intellectual Property and Academic Integrity

Generative AI tools can pose risks to your intellectual property, and can infringe on the intellectual property of others. How the training data for an AI tool is gathered, whether it includes copyright-protected material, and whether proper permissions to use copyright-protected material have been acquired, are all important considerations.

Meet our New Department Chair

DR. MARIA MATTHEWS

The Department of Business and Tourism is excited to welcome Dr. Maria Matthews as its new Chair. With a rich background that blends international academic achievement with decades of hands-on experience in the tourism and hospitality sectors, Dr. Matthews brings a global perspective and deep industry insight to her new role.



Originally from the UK, Dr. Maria Matthews immigrated to Canada 25 years ago and has since built an impressive career spanning over 30 years in tourism and hospitality management and education. What attracted her to MSVU was the university's mission and commitment to inclusive education. She was drawn to the principles of providing education for all and fostering community engagement.

Her academic credentials include a PhD in Tourism

Management from the School of Business and Law at the

University of Brighton (UK), a Master of Business Administration in Tourism and Hospitality Management from AIB (Australia), and a Bachelor of Tourism Management (Hons) from BU (UK).

When it comes to her teaching philosophy, Maria emphasizes the importance of going beyond theory. "Theoretical underpinning is very, very important, but one thing I do bring to the classroom is my industry experience. I do believe that hands-on applied learning is crucial in today's environment, especially when it comes to developing the practical work skills that employers are looking for." Additionally, she places strong value on mentorship in student development, noting how influential her own mentors were in shaping her path. She believes that professors have a responsibility to give back to students, and sees mentorship as a key way to do so, not just academically, but in offering guidance around careers and life. She actively looks for students who stand out, show curiosity, and seek meaningful interaction beyond the classroom.

As Chair, supporting the department's faculty, staff, and students is another of Dr. Matthews's goals. She plans to continue offering professional development for faculty and administration, while also expanding experiential learning opportunities for students both inside and outside the classroom.

MSVU's Business and Tourism Department already offers dynamic initiatives such as the Learning Passport (LP) program, and Social Enterprise for a Day (SE4D). Since introducing a case competition last year, Dr. Matthews is eager to expand both internal and external case competition opportunities, as well as create more avenues for conference participation, research involvement, and consulting projects to further provide experiential learning opportunities for students.

Dr. Matthews's vision is clear: to foster meaningful, experience-based learning that prepares students for success in the competitive business, tourism, and hospitality fields. We look forward to her leadership as we continue to provide an engaging, inclusive, and industry-connected educational experience for all MSVU students.


