Important Degree Program Notes:

- Enroll in the following courses at the same time (concurrently) in the first fall semester that you attend MSVU: THMT 1201 and THMT 1116, plus lab (THMT 116L).
- THMT 2216 labs include mandatory Restaurant Openings (RO) outside scheduled lab times, possibly extending past 8:30 pm (Friday ROs may extend past 4:00 pm). To avoid conflicts, choose a lab section on a day you have no evening classes (online or in-person).
- Students who pass a Mathematics Placement Test and obtain Chair's approval can take Math 2500 in place of Math 2208.
- Students in the co-operative education route must complete a series of professional development sessions prior to completing their first co-op term. Students will begin receiving communication from the Co-op & WIL Centre starting in October, before the first summer co-op work term.
- Students in the work experience route will receive communication from the Co-op & WIL Centre starting in January, before the summer work experience term.
- Students may complete a Concentration in French or Spanish as part of their BTHM program. Students can also complete a minor in another discipline. A minor requires the completion of three units of coursework in the field. Consult the Academic Calendar for more information about these options.
- One arts or science elective course (0.5 unit/1 course maximum) may be substituted for a professional elective with permission of the Department Chair; check with your academic advisor.
- Always seek academic advising every year.

Important Co-op/Work Experience Term(s) Notes:

- THMT 1188 Co-op Term I
 - Prerequisite: Admission to the Bachelor of Tourism and Hospitality Management (Co-operative Education Route) is required. Completion of a professional development program delivered by the Co-op & WIL Centre. Completion of THMT 2216 and completion of the course units prescribed by the Department of Tourism and Hospitality Management course sequence.
- THMT 2288 Co-op Term II
 - Prerequisite: Completion of THMT 1188 and 2202 and courses prescribed by the Department of Tourism and Hospitality Management course sequence.
- THMT 3388 Co-op Term III
 - Prerequisite: Completion of THMT 2288 and courses prescribed by the Department of Tourism and Hospitality Management course sequence.
- THMT 2299 Work Experience I
 - Prerequisites: Admission to the Work Experience Route in the Bachelor of Tourism and Hospitality Management program.
- THMT 3399 Work Experience II
 - Prerequisites: Completion of THMT 2299 and admission to the Work Experience Route in the Bachelor of Tourism and Hospitality Management program.

Important Work Experience term notes:

1. You may ONLY complete the Work Experience route-based BTHM program if you meet ONE of the following criteria:
 - a. You have 7 ½ units of transfer credit or more when you were admitted to the BTHM degree program.
 - b. You have two full years of work experience in the tourism or hospitality fields before you were admitted to the BTHM degree program.
 - c. You are completing your degree on a part-time enrolment basis.
 - d. You are completing your degree on a distance education basis.

If you do not meet one of the criteria above, you are automatically in the Co-operative Education route-based BTHM program.

Honours Degree

Current enrolled students wishing to complete an honours degree must make a formal application to the department Chair after successful completion of 12.5 units. Admission to the honours degree is approved by the Honours Committee of the Department of Business Administration and Tourism & Hospitality Management. Students must have a GPA of 3.0 in required courses (listed under degree requirements) to be considered for admission to the honours degree and must have successfully completed MATH 2208/2209 (or MATH 2500/free elective) and THMT/BUSI 4430 prior to submitting a formal application. Acceptance to the degree is contingent upon the agreement of a faculty member to supervise the thesis.

Honours Certificate

Students who have graduated from Mount Saint Vincent University with a Bachelor of Tourism and Hospitality Management degree may apply to do an honours certificate. Students must fulfill the requirements for the honours degree listed above and meet the university regulations regarding honours certificates.

Obtaining Credit for Previous Professional Study

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Students may count courses from a major, concentration and/or minor towards a second major, concentration and/or minor; however, students must complete a minimum of 50 percent of unique courses toward the second major, concentration and/or minor, unless otherwise stated in the Academic Calendar.
