You must declare your major before registering for your sixth unit of course work. See the Registrar's Office or the departmental administrative assistant for the required form.

Within your course work, you must complete a minimum of one unit of each of the following groups:

A: Sciences and Mathematics
MATH 2208 & 2209 fulfill this requirement.

B: Social Sciences
PSYC fulfills this requirement

C: Humanities

CHIN, CULS, ENGL, FREN, HIST, LIBR, PHIL, RELS, SPAN, WRIT

You may count up to four units of professional study towards your degree. Professional study subjects include:

BUSI, CHYS, EDUC, INTE, NUTR (professional minor), PBRL, PROF (transfer), THMT

Practica or work terms (other than BART 3999 or BSCI 3999) cannot be used for credit for your degree.

You may take up to an additional 2.0 units of PSYC as general electives, if you wish.

Students may count a maximum of 4.0 units of directed/independent/research studies courses towards the degree, with no more than 2.0 units in any single discipline.

A minimum of 9.0 units of your degree must be at the 2000 level or above. <u>Between your two majors, at least</u> 5.0 units at the 3000 level or above are required.

Up to half of your major(s), minor and overall credit requirements may be met via transfer credit (including Letter of Permission Courses). Courses with a "P" grade are GPA neutral.

Your GPA in both of your majors must be ≥ 2.0 . Your overall GPA must be ≥ 1.70 . See the academic calendar for more information.

Between your two majors, you may choose to combine Arts and Science majors (e.g. CHEM + ENGL, BIOL + POLS. In order to graduate with a BA (Combined Major), at least 12 of your 20 total units must be in arts disciplines; a BSc (combined major) requires 12 of your total units must be in science disciplines. PSYC can count as either an Arts or Science.

You may elect to complete a minor as part of your general electives. Refer to minor requirements in the academic calendar for details.

You are strongly encouraged to seek out academic advising throughout your time at the Mount. However, you are ultimately responsible for meeting all degree requirements as listed in the academic calendar.
