First Day Essentials

- A notebook and pen / pencil

 - Headphones optional



First Day Expectations

- Often starts with an overview the syllabus and assignments / expectations
- You may review relevant background material
- The professor may start the first lecture if they have time
- Be prepared to take notes
- You won't need your textbooks on the first day, so you can wait to purchase them until you know that you need them


