

## **Before Coming to Canada: New International Student Checklist**

Receive MSVU Letter of Acceptance, ID number, email address, username and password. If you do not receive your username, password and MSVU email address, please email <a href="mailto:help.">help.</a> help.
Accept your offer by paying the non-refundable Confirmation Deposit at: <a href="www.msvu.ca/pay">www.msvu.ca/pay</a> .  a. If you applied for an undergraduate, diploma or certificate program, pay CAD\$500.  b. If you applied for a graduate program, pay CAD\$100.
Ensure your passport is valid for more than 6 months, otherwise renew it at once (if it is valid for less than 6 months, you won't get a visa or study permit for Canada).
Visa and Study Permit Application:  Do you need a Study Permit? The answer is:  Yes, if your study is for more than 6 months (Study Permit Application Instruction).  No, if your study is less than 6 months.  Do you need a visa, eTA or nothing?  please find it out here: www.cic.gc.ca/english/visit/visas.asp.
Buy travel and medical insurance that will be valid until the Mount's health insurance plan begins in the new semester (Sep 1st for Fall Term, or Jan 1st for Winter Term).
<ul> <li>When arriving in Canada and going through the customs, the CBSA officers will see the following documents:</li> <li>1) Your valid passport with the Canadian student visa (if needed; see above);</li> <li>2) Letter of Important Notice you received from the Canadian consulate. On this letter, there is your name and UCI number;</li> <li>3) MSVU Letter of Acceptance; and</li> <li>4) Your proof of financial support (such as the bank statement you used for your visa application).</li> <li>Note: Always carry the above important documents with you, as well as cash or traveler's checks if you have any. DO NOT place them in your checked luggage.</li> </ul>
If you are not using MSVU airport pick-up, you can go to the Ground Transportation Office in the airport lobby to get a taxi. (the cost will be around CAD\$63: <a href="https://halifaxstanfield.ca/transportation/taxi-limos">https://halifaxstanfield.ca/transportation/taxi-limos</a> ).
If you live on campus, travel to Assisi Hall and pick up your keys at the Security Office (Assisi Hall is No. 18 on the <u>campus map</u> ). If you are living in Birches or Westwood, please ask the taxi driver to wait until you obtain your keys and then drive you to your residence so that you don't need to walk with all your luggage.
Settle in, take a deep breath and relax — you have made it to Mount Saint Vincent University!

- Information about Canadian immigration regulations and your health-insurance policy



Halifax is the capital city of Nova Scotia with a population of approx. 410,000 in 2019. This city is one of the friendliest cities for the students because of the vibrant city life, cultural diversity, and affordable living opportunity.

If you plan to live off-campus, finding a location is the first thing you want to do. In a decent area, rent for one bed apartment rent is approx. CAD 700-900/m. The utilities, internet & telephone will cost you CAD 150-200/month, depending on the usage. Search on Kijiji to find available houses. Groceries will cost around CAD 150/month.

Public transportation is available throughout the city. If you are a full-time student, you can travel by bus for free under your U-pass (September to April).
