Learning Passport: What you need to know

What?

The Learning Passport (LP) program provides students with learning experiences outside of the classroom through activities and events hosted by the Department of Business and Tourism.

By attending eligible events students can earn bonus points in their business and tourism courses:

- Complete two activities: get one bonus point.
- Complete three activities: get two bonus points.
- Complete four activities: get three bonus points.

Students should check with professors to ensure that courses are eligible and to find out about any additional requirements.

Who?

On and off-campus students enrolled in business and tourism courses at Mount Saint Vincent University.

Attend the sign-up session on September 14 in Evaristus (EVAR) 104 at: 9:00 am, 10:30 am, 1:30 pm, or 3:00 pm. You may also submit forms to Miriam Gallant or Colleen Blacker in McCain 405.

Distance students can download forms under the Forms & Form Submissions section of the LP Moodle site. Complete the forms and submit using Moodle under "Submission: Completed Learning Passport (LP) Sign-Up Forms".

When?

The fall Learning Passport program starts September 14, 2017 and concludes November 22, 2017.

Why?

The program is a win-win for students. As a participant in the LP program students are given the opportunity to attend relevant educational and fun networking events. While doing so, students also earn bonus points towards eligible courses.

LP certificates can also be issued and used in portfolios.

How?

Step 1: Complete and submit the Photo/Video Release and LP Sign-Up forms.

Step 2: Sign into the LP Moodle site and plan your activities.

Step 3: From September 14 to November 22, 2017 participate in eligible activities.

Step 4: Ensure your booklet or activity page(s) have been filled out in its entirety and the information is correct.

Step 5: Return your booklet to Miriam Gallant or Colleen Blacker by the LP deadline (November 22, 2017) for the Fall LP Program. Distance students will submit booklets to Moodle.

Step 6: The committee will notify your professors of the number of bonus points to be awarded under the LP.

Do you have a clear plan for your future? Do you want job, a career, or a calling?

Work and Career in the Modern Global Environment (BUSI 2012) is a unique course offered by MSVU's Department of Business and Tourism. The course is designed to help students understand the philosophy, history, and theories of work, as well as help them develop personal career plans.

BUSI 2012 was created and is taught by Dr. Scott MacMillan. Prior to becoming a university professor MacMillan worked across the country in a variety of management positions with the YMCA for twenty years. He conducts research on the meaning of work in people's lives and career development. He also is the author of the book, "The Big Game: 10 Strategies for Winning at Life."

The main objective of this course is to provide students with the opportunity to improve their understanding of themselves and the career they want to pursue. This class may also open students up to paths they never thought of investigating and encourages the idea of a backup plan. During the course students will complete career interest and personality assessments, hear from guest speakers, learn about the current and future global job market, and learn how to find and get the job of their dreams.

BUSI 2012 requires no text book, no prerequisites and has no final exam.

Work and Career in the Modern Global Environment is currently offered once a year in the fall semester on campus. The course is relevant, applicable, and beneficial to everyone. Regardless of faculty study or age, the class is helpful for students in navigating and planning a career.

Volunteer Fair

On Wednesday, September 13 the Annual Volunteer Fair will be taking place at the Rosaria Terrace.

The Volunteer Fair is open to students who wish to volunteer. Students will learn about volunteer opportunities that will help develop career skills while giving back to the community. Volunteering and society involvement are both Co-Curricular Recognition Program (CCRP) eligible activities.

Please note: the Volunteer Fair is not a Learning Passport eligible activity, but volunteering is an eligible activity!

• Students must volunteer a minimum of 10 hours of service at the Mount or with an external not-forprofit organization. Only 10 hours at a single organization will be eligible as an LP activity.

Student Spotlight: Dulendra Sonnadara

Dulendra Sonnadara is a student in the Tourism and Hospitality Management program. Dulendra was born and raised in Sri Lanka. After getting a taste of the tourism industry in Sri Lanka and then moving to Dubai for a couple of years where he worked as a bartender, Dulendra is no stranger to the business.

In 2014, Dulendra made the move to Canada to attend Mount Saint Vincent University and work in Halifax's tourism sector to further his career. Dulendra hit the ground running balancing his studies and work. Last winter Dulendra worked full time while taking six courses, not an easy task! Currently he is working at Shannex as a supervisor. He enjoys his position there and enthusiastically describes how great the company is.

Dulendra explained that he chose to pursue the tourism and hospitality program because of his love for the tourism industry. It allows him to meet new people and experience new cultures, and is constantly changing.

When asked what he enjoyed about the tourism program at the Mount, he spoke of the professors; in particular Dr. Candace Blayney. He elaborated that when he first came to MSVU, Dr. Blayney was his advisor and she really helped him get on the right path.

Dulendra also discussed how he valued his Spanish and French courses, noting their importance in the tourism industry. He explained, "It's helpful to know different languages when working in tourism."

Dulendra describes his dream job as one day being a Food and Beverage Manager in a hotel. He shared that he really enjoys making different drinks for people. Dulendra's dream job was inspired by a mentor he met in Dubai. Rohan was the Food and Beverage Manager where Dulendra bartended. Dulendra describes Rohan as a great people person and an excellent manager. The two are still in contact and Dulendra still seeks advice from him.

For students entering the Tourism and Hospitality program, Dulendra expresses the importance of doing the right thing and being yourself. He wants to reassure students that there are many tourism jobs out there and by putting in the work you will gain the experience needed to be successful. Dulendra adds that the tourism program is great and is the reason he came to MSVU claiming, "It's the best place in Nova Scotia to do a program."

Faculty Focus

Dr. Bona Kim Assistant Professor | Business and Tourism Department

"Knowing what we want will allow us to choose our path. University is about aligning what you want with who you are."

Dr. Bona Kim has been an Assistant Professor with the Department of Business and Tourism since January 2017. Moving from Hong Kong to Halifax eight months ago, Bona says she's still adjusting to Canadian culture and the climate.

Bona received a Ph.D. in Hospitality and Tourism Management from The Hong Kong Polytechnic University. She worked three years in the hotel industry and as a special interest tourism studies researcher for five years at Hong Kong Polytechnic University.

Last winter she taught Intro to Tourism and Hospitality Management (THMT 1101) and Principles of Marketing (BUSI 2230). Bona explains that she enjoys the MSVU campus, working with the friendly Business and Tourism faculty, and most of all meeting the students. Bona spends her days on campus talking to students, doing research, or hanging out in downtown Halifax taking in the city life and appreciating the culture.

Bona explained she chose to come to MSVU for two main reasons. First, she was intrigued by the university's long standing history of Catholicism and women's education. As a professor Bona seeks to inspire female students and as a researcher she is interested in religious tourist experiences. Second, Bona recognizes Halifax is a growing city. She hopes to someday be a bridge between MSVU and international students at other universities.

Bona Kim's research is focused on tourist experiences, fundamental ideas of happiness, and pilgrimages. Dr. Kim is well-travelled, values new experiences, and her research is significantly inspired by her past travelling experiences.

One experience that greatly influenced her personal life and academic career was the Camino de Santiago pilgrimage from the border of France "Saint Jean Pied de Port" to "Santiago de Compostela" in Spain, stretching 850 kilometers. At age 23 Bona completed the trek for the first time. Like 20 year olds, Bona was eager to find her life's path and she found it between France and Spain. On the journey Bona realized she loved interacting with people and she learned the true meaning of hospitality. When she returned home she set out to find a career that aligned with her realizations, settling upon the tourism industry.

Since that first time, Bona has completed the walk four times. She describes the breathtaking elements of the walk, emphasizing the generosity of others, the natural beauty, and culture. After experiencing true hospitality, her goal is to share her experiences with students and help them understand the fundamentals of hospitality in tourism.

Over the years Bona has met and worked with many different people in a number of different places. While working as a researcher in Hong Kong she met a Canadian professor who inspired and mentored her. He and Bona shared similar professional and life values. She explained that his ability to inspire and motivate tourism researchers made her want to educate and nurture students as a researcher and an educator. Bona's mentor was the one to suggest a career at MSVU and helped her make the decision to move. Another influential mentor Bona credits is her Korean Priest. She expressed that he taught her about work-life balances, helped her with issues in her research – pilgrimage's values and history in Catholicism, finding her personal mission as an educator and researcher, and life satisfaction.

Bona says that if she could give students advice, it would be to step forward and out of your comfort zone, try to challenge yourself, explore different things, and meet new people. She encourages students to open their minds and eyes to the world and explains the best way to do so is through pursuing travel.

With regards to school, Bona wants students to know that they should never hesitate to talk to faculty: that professors are here to help you relate to what you're learning. Bona also shares three elements of facilitating a better university life. Number one is friends: having positive friendships with people you can have inspiring conversations with. Number two is having independence and finding ways to be independent. Third is thinking. The more you think the more you understand. These are the elements of happiness.

Through her journeys, education, and work Bona has learned that being able to choose is important. When making a decision about life, school, or a career, Bona wants students to think about themselves and what they truly want. She says, "Knowing what we want will allow us to choose our paths. University is about aligning what you want with who you are. You don't need to have the whole picture of your life puzzle, but you do need an outline of the future you want."

Co-operative Education
