Introductory Remarks

Recently a letter and some information was sent to you by the *Paqtnkek Fish and Wildlife Society* that introduced a study that we are conducting. This study concerns gathering and preserving Mi'kmaq people's knowledge of and experiences with the American Eel (*Kat*). Our purpose is to document the Mi'kmaq peoples use and knowledge of eel so that we can better understand traditional resource use and management practices. We also think it important to rediscover and to preserve the cultural tradition of eel harvesting and use among the Mi'kmaq.

For the past couple of years we have been working in partnership with 'Social Research for Sustainable Fisheries (SRSF)' at St. Francis Xavier University. SRSF is an alliance of community organisations and university social researchers concerned with understanding and supporting the sustainability of fishing and fishing people. The interviews will gather information about eel fishing, preparation and use. All information gathered will be held in strict confidentiality and anonymity. All information will only be used within the guidelines set out by the Mi'kmaw Ethics Committee in their approval of this research. Once this research is completed you will receive a copy of the preliminary research findings report.
