R. Zuk referenced the ad hoc committee of CAPP responsible for selecting valedictorians and questioned, given the last-minute withdrawal of a Valedictorian in the spring, whether CAPP is considering a review of weightings assigned to the various components considered during the selection process.

E. Church advised that, following Convocation, CAPP reviewed and revised the procedure used in the selection process. She outlined the changes made to the process including a review of nominations by Department Chairs and the attestation by candidates that their background is free of incidents that would bring disrepute to the reputation of the University.

# 5. President's Announcements

The President updated Senators on the Vice-President Academic and Provost Search Committee and Strategic Planning Working Group activities and encouraged all to participate in the survey being circulated by the search consultant.

She provided a summary of internal and external stakeholder and Government meetings and events that she attended or in which she participated. She highlighted the success of the International Day of the Girl Child celebration hosted by the Mount and acknowledged S. Brigham for her work on the event; all were thanked for their contribution to its success. She also noted that S. Theunissen and C. McLean had been recognized at a recent luncheon for their boat-building project and K. Whitfield, J. L. McIsaac, and G. MacDonald were recognized within the NS Health Research Foundation annual report.

In conclusion, she encouraged Senators to attend the upcoming Convocation events on November 4 and the Board Retreat Reception on November 23. She asked all to mark their calendars for the March 8, 2019, International Girls Conference to be held on Campus in celebration of International Women's Day.

G. MacDonald advised Senators of recent NSHRF funding awarded to J. L. McIsaac, Canada Research Chair in Early Childhood, and K. Whitfield, Assistant Professor, Applied Human Nutrition, and highlighted several student research awards.

She also highlighted a meeting with Facilities Management, the launch of ReconciliACTION, and the overwhelming success of the recent Haunted House event. She concluded by highlighting the Racialized and Indigenous Student Experience (RISE) summit being hosted on Campus this weekend.

A question was raised on whether the situation with menstrual products, highlighted at the last meeting, has improved. M. Mitchell noted that the situation is improving and that positive conversations are being held.
