- 4. President's Announcements

R. Lumpkin mentioned "Time of Trouble", the opera about the Sisters of Charity and their struggle with the bishop in the nineteenth century. She also mentioned the upcoming Board of Governors retreat, which will include presentations on the Co-op Program and technology in the classroom. She reminded Senators of the reception event planned for Senate and BOG members on Nov. 20th before the Multicultural night dinner (a formal invitation will follow). She concluded by mentioning the success of the fourth annual Research Remixed event held on October 15th.

5. Question Period

R. Green mentioned that she understood that the undergraduate scholarship recommendation tick boxes will be removed from web-advisor grade reports, and that scholarships will henceforward be determined on GPA only. She expressed concern, mentioning that this change would disadvantage students in some programs.

- M. Whalen responded that this item is a small part of the changes to the scholarship program intended in part to provide better scholarship support for in-course students. He added that the tick box recommendations were not well used by faculty, and these changes will now go to CAPP and then forward to Senate for approval. M.Whalen added that the Undergraduate Admissions and Scholarships Committee had reviewed grades and determined that students in particular programs were not disadvantaged.
- B. Taylor noted that the Dean's Office had just received a grade distribution report that indicated discrepancies across departments.
- R. Lumpkin added that quite a bit of data will be need to be included when this item comes to Senate for approval.
- J. Grant asked about the provincial provision for tuition adjustments.
- R. Lumpkin responded that the first discussion of this item will be held at the BOG retreat tomorrow.
