## Structural Parallelism

- I like hockey, handicrafts, and going to the races.
- Inconvenient ice times and spending so much money on equipment may deter some parents from enrolling their daughters in hockey.
- Both getting to the rink before dawn and the cost of equipment are deterrents to participation.

Parallel structures in sentences keep the reader on track. Parallelism is required for items in a list, coordinate structures (using and, or) and correlative structures (using either/or, neither/nor, both/and)

## **Solutions**

Find and use the structure that works for all the elements. There is usually more than one way to get your structures into line; if one doesn't work, try another. A bonus is that fixing parallelism sometimes makes your ideas more specific and therefore clearer to your reader.

• I like hockey, handicrafts, and race-going.

LIST: ALL NOUN STRUCTURES (the last one is a verbal noun)

I like playing hockey, making handicrafts, and going to the races.

CO-ORDINATE: ALL PARTICIPLE STRUCTURES

• I like watching hockey, designing handicrafts, and betting on the races.

CO-ORDINATE: ALL PARTICIPLE STRUCTURES, but a different meaning.

• Inconvenient ice times and the high cost of equipment may deter some parents from enrolling their daughters in hockey.

CO-ORDINATE: BOTH STRUCTURES BASED ON NOUNS

• Both the inconvenient ice times and cost of equipment are deterrents to participation.

CORRELATIVE: BOTH STRUCTURES BASED ON NOUNS.

• Neither getting to the rink before dawn nor spending hundreds of dollars on equipment will deter some parents from supporting their Wickenhauser wannabe.

CORRELATIVE: BOTH STRUCTURES BASED ON PARTICIPLES.
