Post Graduation Work Permit (PGWP) Application

You must apply for the Post-Graduation Work Permit with a valid Study Permit and within 90 days of receiving your Eligibility to Graduate Letter/Program Completion letter. **Important:** as soon as you receive all your final grades, you can request this letter from the Registrar's Office as it is not automatically issued to students who are graduating. NOTE: if you missed the 90-day period or if your Study Permit has expired please [contact your Immigration Advisor.](#)

1. Log in to your online immigration account using GKey or Sign-in Partner

*If you are a new user, you will need to create your account through GKey or Sign-in Partner.

NOTE: Save your username and password. Consider taking a screenshot of all your security questions and answers to avoid getting locked out of your account. Once you are locked out of your account, you will never be able to access it ever again.

If you do not have a personal reference code, you may answer a series of questions to find out if you are eligible to apply for a visa and/or permit, apply for Express Entry, and begin an online application.

If you begin your application **after you have logged into your account**, you will not receive a personal reference code, as the system will save your document checklist right into your account.

Medical Exam

IMPORTANT: in-Canada applications only

IRCC created a [temporary public policy](#) for immigration medical exams (IMEs) **until October 5, 2029 only**. If you completed an IME within the past 5 years, submit a copy of your previous medical exam.

To qualify for this temporary policy, you must meet **all** of these conditions:

- You applied, or are applying, for either permanent residence or temporary residence.
- You already live in Canada.
- You completed your previous IME in the last 5 years.
- Your previous IME indicated a low risk or no risk to public health or public safety.

NOTE: You need to submit your proof of medical exam performed by an IRCC approved physician if you plan to work in the fields of education, childcare, medical and healthcare services, nursing homes, taking care of elderly and other vulnerable people, hospital, and agriculture, etc. Click on this link to [view the list of IRCC approved physicians by country](#) to book your appointment if necessary.

Proof of English Language Proficiency

Starting November 1, 2024, PGWP applicants from a university are required to submit proof of English proficiency with a score equivalent to Canadian Language Benchmark (CLB) 7 and above. [Read more here](#).

Mount Saint Vincent University is a designated CELPIP test centre so you can complete the test on-campus.

How to book your test at MSVU?

- Book your CELPIP test through this link: <https://celPIP-registration.paragontesting.ca/registration/#/registration/sitting-selection>
- Select General Test → Immigration, Refugees, and Citizenship Canada → Permanent Residence/Temporary Residence → Canada → Nova Scotia → Halifax → look for MSVU

How long does it take?

- The total test time is under 3 hours and is done in one sitting.
 - Listening (47–55 minutes): Listen to passages and answer questions
 - Reading (55–60 minutes): Read passages and answer questions
 - Writing (53–60 minutes): Respond to questions with written answers
 - Speaking (15–20 minutes): Reply to on-screen prompts verbally

How much does it cost?

- \$290 plus tax

How to prepare?

What to bring with you?

- Required ID for the test registration: your original passport (no photocopy or electronic copies)

Where is the test exam?

- Seton Academic building room 331 (the computer lab)

How and when to get your test score?

- Log in to your CELPIP account 3-4 business days after your test date.

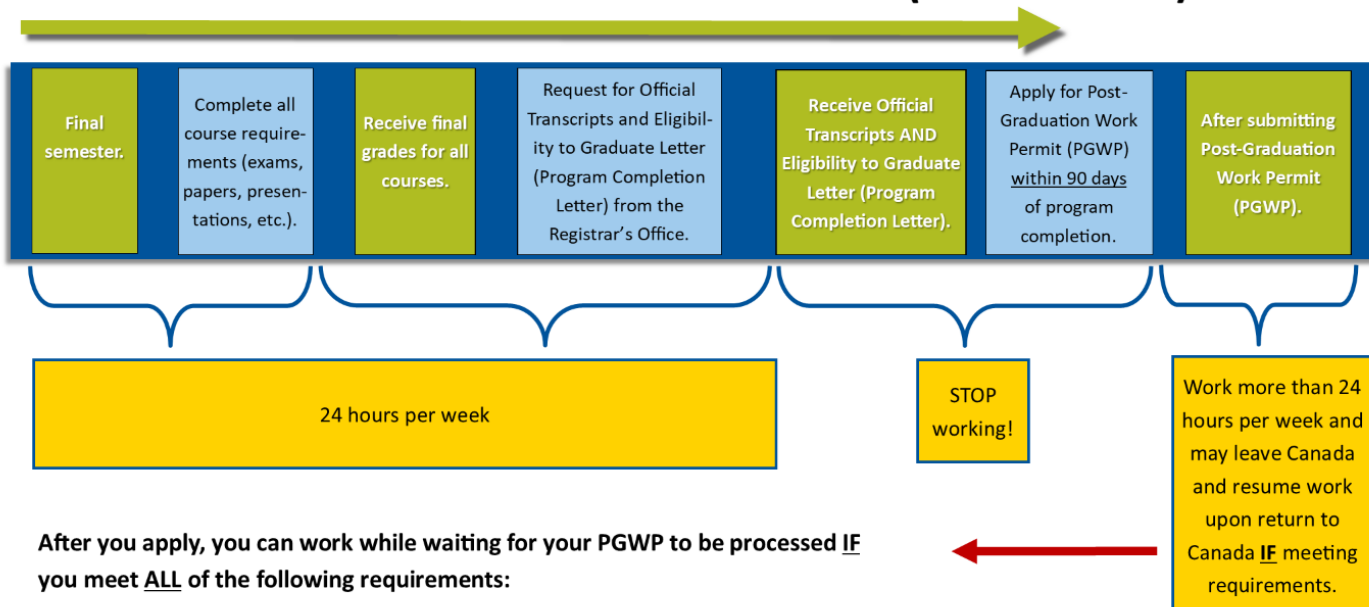

7. Submit the application

Once your application has been successfully transmitted, you will receive a confirmation of application submission under “My Messages” or on your home account page.

POST - GRADUATION WORK PERMIT TIMELINE (inside Canada):



After you apply, you can work while waiting for your PGWP to be processed IF you meet ALL of the following requirements:

- your Study Permit was valid during your PGWP application,
- you meet the off-campus work authorization requirements,
- you maintained full-time status, except in your final semester,
- AND you did not work more than the authorized number of hours while studying.
