



Renewing your Study Permit inside Canada

Do not allow your study permit to expire for any reason. If your study permit expires before you can complete your studies, you must renew it at least a month before the expiry date. **NOTE:** if your passport is expiring, you must apply for a new passport before applying for your study permit. Also, if you intend to work in Canada after you graduate, you will need a valid study permit when you apply for your Post-Graduation Work Permit. **If your study permit has expired, please follow the Study Permit Restoration step-by-step guide.**

1. Log in to your online immigration account using GKey or Sign-in Partner

**If you are a new user, you will need to create your account through GKey or Sign-in Partner.*

NOTE: Save your username and password. Consider taking a screenshot of all your security questions and answers to avoid getting locked out of your account. Once you are locked out of your account, you will never be able to access it ever again.

Write a short letter of explanation to request for a study permit extension that is valid 90 days after your expected program completion. At the bottom of your Enrolment Letter, you will find your Expected Program Completion date. From that date, calculate an additional 90 days and specify that exact date on your letter of explanation.

For example, your program completion is April 2026, you will write... “I would like to request for a study permit extension that is valid until July 31, 2026 because I intend to apply for my PGWP after completing my program in April 2026. The reason for this request is because I would need the extra time to gather the required documents for the PGWP application. The letter may include additional information that is necessary to your situation – please consult your Immigration Advisor regarding this.

Note: this is a formal letter to IRCC so please ensure your letter is formal in tone and structure.

- imm5709e – primary application form to stay in Canada as a student
- Digital photo – similar to a passport photo and you can use your phone to take your photo

- Passport – scan all pages except blank pages. Save multiple pages as 1 PDF file
- Confirmation of Enrolment Letter from MSVU Registrar's Office
- Official Transcripts from MSVU Registrar's Office
- Proof of funds (account summary statement of balance from your bank). Ideally, a minimum of \$5,000 CAD for individual students. If you have family member(s) with you, you would need a greater amount.
- Letter of explanation – upload this in the section 'Client Information'
- Medical exam (optional)
- Study Permit

Enrolment Letter and Official Transcripts

For the enrolment letter, fill out the **Letter Request Form** from this [webpage](#) and email it to heather.standing@msvu.ca and if she is on vacation, you can email it to stephanie.hale@msvu.ca. **Do NOT go to the Registrar's Office counter and do NOT email registration@msvu.ca for this letter.**

Note: When filling out the form, you must choose **all** of the following options:

- Visa Letter
- Extension of permit renewal
- and Other option box of Visa Letter, you should write 'Study Permit extension. PAL exempt'.

For Official Transcripts, you can go in-person to receive it right away OR you can fill out the [Transcript Request Form](#) and email it to transcripts@msvu.ca.

Medical Exam

IMPORTANT: inside Canada applications only

IRCC created a [temporary public policy](#) for immigration medical exams (IMEs) **until October 5, 2029 only**. If you completed an IME within the past 5 years, submit a copy of your previous medical exam.

To qualify for this temporary policy, you must meet **all** of these conditions:

- You applied, or are applying, for either permanent residence or temporary residence.
- You already live in Canada.
- You completed your previous IME in the last 5 years.
- Your previous IME indicated a low risk or no risk to public health or public safety.

NOTE: You need to submit your proof of medical exam performed by an IRCC approved physician if you plan to work in the fields of education, childcare, medical and healthcare services, nursing homes, taking care of elderly and other vulnerable people, hospital, and agriculture, etc. Click on this link to [view the list of IRCC approved physicians by country](#) to book your appointment if necessary.
