Dear Employer:

This letter is to certify that Graduate Name will be eligible for hiring under the Graduate to Opportunity (GTO) funding program until 12-month end date.

If you take advantage of the program, you will receive a subsidy of 25% or 35% of your new employee's first-year salary, and 12.5% of their second-year salary. The job has to be a new, permanent, full-time position that pays at least \$30,000 a year.

If you operate a small business of under 100 full-time employees, a start-up, a not-for-profit organization, or a social enterprise, you qualify for funding.

Applying for Graduate to Opportunity is easy and quick: we normally turn around complete applications within three or four days.

Hundreds of Nova Scotian employers have already made use of GTO, and they've discovered what a great impact a motivated, well-educated graduate can have on their businesses. These employers are also contributing to the retention of talented youth in our province and helping to secure our economic future.

I hope you'll consider making use of GTO. You can learn more and apply for funding at novascotia.ca/GTO. Remember that you need to be approved for funding before hiring the grad.
