# Mount Bursary & Scholarship Program

## Entrance Scholarships

Entrance scholarship awards are made to students entering Mount Saint Vincent directly from high school, except where specifically noted otherwise. Note: Presidential Scholarships require an application.

Students entering directly from high school who are only applying for basic entrance awards **do not** require a separate scholarship application form, but may want to include a resume of experience or letter of explanation to further indicate their suitability. Entrance scholarship awards are made for one year only and are not automatically renewable. Students are evaluated annually and scholarship decisions are made according to their most recent academic results. All entrance scholarships are renewable rewards and can be maintained through the duration of a student's undergraduate degree. A student must maintain a 3.5 GPA in their first year and a 3.7 in their remaining years to receive their scholarship. Students are also eligible for in-program scholarships, which are awarded based on GPA within their program.

## Eligibility Criteria for Entrance Scholarships

High school entrants with a minimum 80 percent average and high ranking within their class will be considered (applicants must have completed five academic course, one of which must English). The Committee on Undergraduate Admissions and Scholarships may request additional information from students or from school counselors before making an award.

Only students applying for admission prior to **March 1, 2022** will be considered for Entrance Scholarships, which are offered in May. Enquiries concerning Entrance Scholarships should be directed to the Admissions Office.

**Application Deadline: March 1, 2022**

Some courses require specific course criteria for Admissions. Please refer to the online academic calendar for specific criteria or contact the Admissions Office at 902-457-6117.

# Mount Bursary & Scholarship Program continued



The Mount is proud to have a generous scholarship program that recognizes outstanding academic performance and helps alleviate the cost of going to university.

## 2020-2021 Academic Year:

### 1. Entrance Scholarship Awards – no separate application required

#### a. *Admission to University and a minimum of an 80 average:*

To automatically be considered for an entrance scholarships, you need to submit a complete application for admission to the University by **March 1**.

### 2. Entrance Scholarships Awards - specific applications required

- a. High school students who apply for admission before March 1 with an average of 80 percent or more qualify for an entrance scholarship – specific applications required. To be considered, these entrance scholarships require supplemental application material (such as resume, references, recommendations, etc).

- b. To automatically be considered for a Diamond Jubilee entrance scholarship, you must a mature student, submit a complete application for admission to the University by **March 1** with an average of 80 percent or more.

### Example:

1. **President's Scholarship:** Full Coverage (Cost of tuition, food & residence - (Renewable))
2. **Harrison McCain:** 80 percent (min) + Financial need – (Renewable)

## Academic Concerns:

- What is the fifth year to finish degree policy?

- Health care of athletes?

- Student housing and meal plan?
- For students on meal plans, is food kept late for practices?

- What happens if an athlete is seriously injured during competition? (Road game/home game)
- Is it possible to work part time in addition to playing and studying?
- What is a typical "day in the life" like for a member of your team during the season?.



## Athlete Questionnaire continued



### Athletic Concerns:

- What positions are you being recruited for?
- What other players are they recruiting?
- Recruitment of other players at your position?
- Will you be able to play, considering returnees?
- What is their style of play?
- What is the Head Coaches philosophy?
- What are the team policies?
- How does the team get along?
- What is the level of competition?
- What media coverage does the program get?
- What kind of facilities are available to the team?
- What is the practice schedule?
- Do you play doubleheaders with other varsity teams?
- Are there summer/pre/post season workouts?
- Can you participate in intramural activities?
- What do I have to do over the summer to ensure I am in good shape to make the team?
- How many years of eligibility do I have?

- When is the next time we can speak / meet?
- Is there anything I can provide you with that will help you further evaluate me?
