Looking for work

- It's the **student's responsibility** to find work we have GREAT, FREE resources and support to help you!
- Typically, you will apply online or by email with a resume and cover letter, individualized for that job
- For most study permits, working on campus does NOT count toward your 20-hour limit for work during the academic year. However, students must consider balancing academic studies and paid work
- Minimum wage is \$13.35 per hour in Nova Scotia.
 On October 1, 2022 it will increase to \$13.60. By
 April 2024 it will be \$15 per hour.



- An on-campus work schedule is flexible with your class schedule – classes come first. Work is usually within Monday to Friday
- Pay is at or above minimum wage
- Opportunity to work in your field of study
- If you're hired and the work term goes well, you can ask your supervisor to be a Canadian reference for your next job application

 - Job posting usually comes out in March on <u>Career</u> <u>Connects</u> and through Counselling Services/Health Office for academic year ahead



Student Works

- Eligible students:
 - Demonstrate financial need (through the job application)
 - Be a FULL time Mount student in the 2022/23 academic year
 - Be living in Canada
 - Have a valid Canadian social insurance number and bank account
 - Hold a valid study permit (if an international student)
- 12 hours per week, \$15 per hour + vacation pay
- Different positions; great match with programs of study
- Flexible with class schedule (working within Monday to Friday 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. in general)



Student Works

- Apply in late February/early March for full-time work during the summer (35 hours per week)
- Apply in early September for part-time work during the Fall and Winter terms (12 hours per week)
- Apply on Career Connects

 - *Access Career Connects 3 days before academic program or term starts. **Use your Mount email and password to access the site.** Contact helpdesk@msvu.ca if you have trouble getting in
- Sometimes Student Works and on campus positions are posted throughout the year. It's good to keep checking!

Beware! Job scams

What is normal

- You submit a resume and cover letter (you're not contacted as an 'applicant')
- An interview in-person or by video conferencing
- You can give personal information <u>after</u> you money receive a written job account offer
 MSVU Job Scam Prevention Tips

What is a potential scam

- A job title and pay that seem too high to be realistic. E.g. Part-time Financial Manager for \$24/hour
- A list of tasks that are vague
- Asking you to deposit money into <u>your</u> bank account

Co-curricular Record (CCR)

- A digital certificate of competencies you've earned through volunteering (on campus or off campus) or participating in extra-curricular activities
- Volunteering = increasing your transferable skills
 AND Canadian-based skills and work experience
- You can work on your CCR during your time at MSVU
- Open your CCR online on <u>Career Connects</u>



Resume and cover letter

- Cover letter (1 page) *Change it every time you apply to a job
- Resume (1 or 2 pages)
- Canadian context: show your merit and explain your past experiences and what you can do for the organization
- MSVU Career Services Resume and Cover Letter Handbook (demonstration)
 - Action verbs
 - Accomplishment statements (how to show your merit)
 - Visual examples



Resume and cover letter

- Canadian context
 - Personal details like age, relationship status, Canadian Social Insurance Number, or photos do not go on your resume or cover letter
 - Consider voluntarily self-declaring if the employer has a self-declaration survey or diversity policy
- You can include 3 references on a separate page in your application (professors, past supervisors)



Job search tips

- Most employers accept applications online
- For funded student programs, read the details carefully to make sure you're eligible (e.g. job posting open to current students versus open to students who are Canadian citizens or permanent residents)
- See job posting websites on <u>Career Services Work</u> and <u>Volunteer page</u>



Tools to use while at MSVU

- Explore LMI
 - View wages, job outlooks, and job posting across Canada
- Explore Careers Nova Scotia
 Find job prospects, wages, education/training paths in NS
- CanLearn Program Search
 - Lists all programs for Canadian postsecondary institutions, including graduate schools (Career Services can help you review the process and your letter of intent!)
