GENERAL WORKING PAPER GUIDELINES

Format

Please submit your documents in Word (no PDFs or Google Docs). Include page numbers and follow APA formatting (use Times New Roman, 12-point font, double spaced).

Academic Integrity

We reserve the right to withdraw submissions and/or take other action as required to deal with violations of academic integrity.

The Cover Page Must Contain the Following Funding Acknowledgement:

DISCUSSION PAPER GUIDELINES

- Discussion papers should be **no more than 5000 words** including works cited.
- Discussion papers do not need to be fully fleshed out research papers but need to have a coherent argument that is ready to be shared.
- Discussion papers will be reviewed by members of our executive team. Feedback will be provided, and authors are expected to revise their work before publication on the TMC Network website.

- Discussion papers can be directed broadly to practitioners, researchers, government officials, and policymakers, and the general public as their readership.
- Use clear language, avoid academic jargon and obscure or technical terms, and provide a well-explained argument for a broad but knowledgeable audience.
- Discussion papers should avoid extended discussions of academic and discipline-specific theory or literature that may be inaccessible to those outside of academia.
- Use APA in-text citations.
- Include a cover page with author details, such as title and affiliation, and the funding acknowledgement found at the beginning of this document.
- Include a **250-300 word abstract** and **3-5 keywords**.

RESEARCH PAPER GUIDELINES

- Research papers should be **no more than 8000 words** including works cited.
- Research papers cover a topic in an effective, thorough, and academic manner and present a well-developed thesis, supported by evidence.
- Research papers will follow the general conventions of academic articles.
- Research papers will be peer reviewed by Network members or other peers. Feedback will be provided, and authors are expected to revise their work before publication on the TMC Network website.
- Use APA in-text citations.
- Please include a cover page with author details, title, and the funding acknowledgement found at the beginning of this document.
- Please include a **250-300 word abstract** and **3-5 keywords**.
