2022-2023 Banting Postdoctoral Fellowships (Banting PDF) competition

The Banting Postdoctoral Fellowships program is designed to support world-class postdoctoral researchers. The fellowship provides \$70,000 per year for two years. The program is open to both Canadian and international researchers who have recently completed a PhD, PhD- equivalent, or health professional degree. Applications must be completed in full collaboration with the proposed host institution.

Fullbright Opportunities in the USA

The Canada-U.S. Fulbright Program operates on the principle of reciprocal exchange and provides the opportunity for outstanding Canadian scholars to lecture and/or conduct research in the United States. Award recipients include prominent and promising scholars, as well as experienced professionals. During a Fulbright scholars can: conduct research; deliver lectures; network, promote their work; formal teaching (only if the awards allow it). The grants support research with colleagues in the US for a **4-to-9-month** period. For more information, click here.

Special Response Fund for Trainees (Ukraine)

Through the Special Response Fund for Trainees (Ukraine), CIHR, NSERC, and SSHRC have supported many trainees who are directly impacted by the crisis in Ukraine. These funding agencies have established a limited-time Special Response Fund for Trainees (Ukraine), or SRFT-Ukraine, to initiate or maintain the employment or financial support—via stipend or salary—of graduate students and postdoctoral researchers who are directly impacted by the crisis in Ukraine.

Canada is recognized as a leader in building partnerships and uniting researchers and highly qualified personnel of different nationalities and cultures in the shared pursuit of scientific excellence. Recognizing how the crisis in Ukraine may affect the research

landscape, this additional funding for grant holders will support trainees, defined as graduate students or postdoctoral researchers, through salaries and stipends. Support can be requested for a period of up to 12 months. The maximum allowable amounts are as follows: Master's level - up to \$20,000, Doctoral level - up to \$25,000, Postdoctoral level - up to \$45,000. Applications will be accepted using a continuous intake up to **December 22, 2022**.

NSERC's PromoScience Program offers financial support for organizations working with young Canadians to promote an understanding of science and engineering (including mathematics and technology). Organizations may request funds for up to three years at a time. PromoScience supports hands-on learning experiences for young students and their teachers. Grants may be used to cover improvements to program content or delivery, as well as for new programs and activities. Grants can also be used to cover operational costs such as salaries, travel, postage, materials and supplies, provided that they relate to the promotion of science and engineering.

I put on my puppy hood to make myself feel better, thus immersing me into my puppy headspace. My inner pup scarcely notices bodies, neither mine nor others'. He's too busy remembering the great times he's had (and will again have) to care about such trivial things! I hope this short little puppy philm can suggest a completely different way of life to those who view it; a less stressful, less perfectionist, less bitchy alternative that encourages folks to have a little fun with life before it comes to an end. [NEW] NSERC's Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion Newest Resources

NSERC is taking action to help the natural sciences and engineering (NSE) research communities contribute to a more equitable, diverse and inclusive research enterprise, with the launch of the NSERC guide on integrating equity, diversity and inclusion considerations in research. The new guide is designed to assist NSE researchers with applying a critical equity, diversity and inclusion (EDI) lens in their work by providing guiding questions and examples relevant to their field of research. It includes two main sections:

- 1. Guidance on embedding EDI considerations at each stage of the research process including: research questions, design of the study, methodology and data collection, analysis and interpretation and dissemination of results.
- 2. EDI considerations for research teams, including: building teams, recruitment and retention, and the roles of team members throughout the course of the research project.

Since 2019, Alliance applicants must include EDI considerations in their training plan. A dedicated Alliance EDI resource was recently updated to further expand on the expectations of this mandatory evaluation criteria and provide applicants with examples of what concrete EDI best practices look like.
