



Part II MSVU Email, Username, and Password

Part II MSVU Email, Username, and Password




- Your username is as follows: First initial followed by last name. If your email address has a number, so will your username. (Mount App, Financial Statements, Account Activity Statement, WebAdvisor, library searches, accessing MSVU PCs on Campus etc...)
- Your email address will be your full first name, followed by your last name. If you are unsure about if your email may or may not have a number, contact IT&S and we will assist you (Moodle, myMount).
- Your initial password is a ten character password starting with MSVU and the last six characters being your date of birth in ddmmyy (two-digit day, month and year) format. For Example: If your date of birth was January 24, 1953, then your password would be Msvu240153.
- Please login to myMount email in order to reset your MSVU Account password in the link below: https://www.msvu.ca/mymount.
- After having logged in successfully, you will see a Self-Service Password Reset (SSPR) setup window indicating: "More information is required. Your organization needs more information to keep your account secure."
- Follow the steps to set up your future password recovery methods; we recommend setting up at least two methods for recovery.
- Once your recovery methods are setup you should not be prompted again. If on some future date you need to use SSPR to reset your password, you can follow the link on the MSVU page for forgotten password to reset your password.

Instructions:

- 1. Download an authenticator app on your phone;
- Log in to your <u>myMount</u>. The initial MFA setup will require you to link your mobile phone number to your MSVU account by receiving a text message;
- 3. After the initial setup, you can add the authenticator app and use it as your preferred authentication method.
- 4. If you need to switch to a new phone, **do not** delete the MFA app on your old phone until you set it up on your new phone. **Back up** your MS/Google account before you switch to your new phone.




Google Authenticator





- 2. Then click "Microsoft 365 apps" (Picture 2);







MSVU offers high speed Internet access across campus.

Campus Wireless Networks

Mount Wi-Fi

MSVU Students, faculty and staff should use the 'Mount Wi-Fi' secure wireless network by using their MSVU email address and password.

Note:

- username: the one you received from helpdesk@msvu.ca
- password: the same as for your MSVU email

Eduroam

Eduroam lets people from other higher education institutions get internet access at the MSVU. Find out more about <u>Eduroam at the MSVU</u>.

Note:

- username: your full MSVU email address
- password: the same as for your MSVU email

How to add Mount WiFi to your Android device

Note: Locations and names of settings may be different from what is shown here. Check your phone's manual if required.

1. Go to "Settings" > "Connections" > "WiFi".

2. Tap on "Mount WiFi" and input the following settings if prompted:

EAP method: PEAP.

Identity: Your MSVU Email.

Password: Your MSVU email password.

Anonymous Identity: Leave blank, if prompted enter123@msvu.ca.

Certificate: Use System Certificates.

CA Certificate: For Android 10: Default or Do not check. For Android 11+: Use system certificates.

Online Certificate: Do not validate or Request Access.

Domain: clearpass.msvu.ca.

EAP/Advanced Phase 2authentication: MSCHAPV2.

3. Tap "Connect".

How to add Mount WiFi to your Chromebook

Note: Locations and names of settings may be different from what is shown here, check your Chomebook's manual if required.

- 1. At the bottom right, select the time.
- Select the WiFi icon (usually says: "Not Connected") which will open the "Networks" section of the Chromebook's settings page.

Note: If you see your Wi-Fi network name and a signal strength, your Chromebook is already connected to Wi-Fi.

- Click the WiFi right-pointing arrow on the right-hand side to search for WiFi networks. Your Chromebook will automatically look for available networks and show them to you in a list.
- 5. Click on "Mount WiFi" and input the following settings if prompted:

EAP method: PEAP.

EAP/Advanced Phase 2Authentication: MSCHAPV2.

Identity: Your MSVU Email.

Password: Your MSVU email password.

Anonymous Identity: Leave blank, if prompted enter123@msvu.ca.

CA Certificate: Do not check.

Online Certificate: Do not validate or Request Access.

Domain: clearpass.msvu.ca.

iOS iPhone/iPad



How to add Mount WiFi to your iPhone

- 1. Tap on the "Settings" app.
- 2. Tap on "Wi-Fi".
- 3. Choose the Wi-Fi you want to connect to.
- 4. Enter your MSVU email address and myMount password. Tap "Join" in the top-right to connect to the network.
- 5. Tap "Trust" in the top right when prompted to connect.

Mac



How to add Mount WiFi to your Mac

- 1. Click on the "WiFi" icon on the menu bar in the top-right hand corner of the Mac desktop.
- 2. Select the "Mount WiFi" network.
- 3. Enter your MSVU email address and myMount password, and click "OK".

Note: You can also make sure the "Remember this information" is checked so the Mac will automatically re-connect to the Mount WiFi the next time you restart the Mac or are at MSVU.

4. Click "Continue" to when prompted to connect and to verify the network certificate.

How to add Mount WiFi to your Windows PC

- Click on the "WiFi" icon in the bottom-right hand corner of the login screen or in the bottom-right hand corner of the taskbar on your desktop.
- 2. Select the "Mount WiFi" network.
- 3. Enter your MSVU email address and myMount password, and click "Sign In".

Note: You can also make sure the "Automatically Save Credentials" is checked so the PC will automatically re-connect to the Mount WiFi the next time you restart the PC at MSVU.

4. When prompted to use a security certificate, click "Connect" to connect to the Mount WiFi network.

Part VII MSVU Mobile App



MSVU SAFE is a free campus safety app designed to be a one-stop safety shop that connects users to a variety of safety and security tools and resources –all in the palm of your hand. To make maximum use of the app, users must have location services and calling services enabled. The app includes the following features:

- Virtual Walk Home
- Support Resources
- Travel Safe
- Campus Maps
- Emergency Procedures
- Class Cancellation
- Safety Toolbox





Moodle & Blackboard Collaborate



Moodle is the MSVU's Learning Management System and is used for most course deliveries, including face-to-face, online, blended and multi-access. It allows faculty to create and manage course content, host online discussions, administer quizzes and meet in real time with students. Moodle provides a place where students can access course content, submit assignments, complete activities, and communicate with their peers and their instructor.




Blackboard Collaborate is our online classroom software. It provides a virtual space where faculty and students can meet in real-time, work in groups, chat, and learn together.
