Dr. Kazeem Adefemi is a Postdoctoral Research Fellow and Epidemiologist with the NL Centre for Applied Health Research (NLCAHR) at Memorial University of Newfoundland. He holds a PhD in Population Health (with Distinction) from Memorial University, a Master of Public Health (MPH) from Curtin University in Australia, Bachelor of Human Anatomy from University of Ilorin in Nigeria and is a SAS Certified Specialist. With over 12 years of

experience, Dr. Adefemi combines expertise in advanced quantitative and qualitative research with a strong background in program management, evaluation and health policy development.

In his current role with the Atlantic Research Collaboration on Long-Term Care (ARC LTC), Dr. Adefemi contributes advanced quantitative analysis to the multi-provincial Quality of Work Life study. His research focuses on identifying organizational and personal factors predictive of quality of work life outcomes among healthcare workers in Atlantic Canadian long-term care facilities, providing a crucial evidence base for policy reform and retention strategies.

Prior to his current position, Dr. Adefemi demonstrated a commitment to addressing health inequities through diverse leadership roles in Canada and internationally. His experience ranges from leading large-scale regional health programs for Malaria and HIV/AIDS in Nigeria to managing community-based support programs in Australia. Notably, he recently led consultations to design a unified provincial data framework for women's shelters in Newfoundland and Labrador, directly informing program funding. He has authored over 15 peer-reviewed publications and is a Fellow of Memorial University of Newfoundland's School of Graduate Studies.
