"Invisible No More: Canadian Women Veterans Moving the ACVA Report Recommendations to Full Implementation"

- Our project focuses on the parliamentary study that culminated in the 2024 Report of the Standing Committee on Veterans Affairs (ACVA), [Invisible No More. The Experiences of Canadian Women Veterans.](#)
- Our project engages Canadian women Veterans, from both the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP), in participatory action research and knowledge translation.
- The purpose of our project is to ensure the voices of women Veterans are integrated into the implementation of the report's recommendations.

As part of this project, we are conducting research interviews with women Veterans. You are eligible to participate in this research if you meet all three of the following criteria:

- 1) You have served in the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) or the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP), completed basic or depot training, and are at this time no longer serving (i.e., you are a former CAF or RCMP member);
- 2) You identify as a woman;
- 3) You are the age of majority in your province of residence.

AND you meet one of the following criteria:

- a) You participated in the ACVA study that resulted in the final report *Invisible No More. The Experiences of Canadian Women Veterans*. You participated by providing verbal in-person **or** virtual testimony before the Standing Committee on Veterans Affairs (ACVA) **or** by submitting a written brief to ACVA (as sole author or co-author) as part of the study.
- b) You did not participate in the ACVA study that resulted in the final report *Invisible No More. The Experiences of Canadian Women Veterans*. However, you **either** asked to participate (formally or informally) **or** were asked to participate (formally or informally), even though you did not end up participating in the study conducted by ACVA.
