Description

What We Did

3 Focus Groups, 11 Participants

- 4 continuing care assistants
- 5 LTC stakeholders
- 2 family/friends of someone living in LTC

What We Heard & What We Changed

Overall, there was a positive reaction to the video with key recommendations for improvement:



PACING

- Slow down overall pace
- Breaks between sections
- Additional shorter video format for social media

"I thought that the person speaking went quite fast...I would slow that [video] down to try to really take in the information and what that means"



MESSAGE

- Catch attention at the start to connect with viewers
- Emphasize care aides' workload vs. wellbeing
- Balance positive/negative tone.
- Add a clear call to action

"We show up because we care"



VISUALS

- Remove clinical imagery
- Consistent animation style
- More diversity among staff
- Simpler visuals and charts

"I think that could be more diverse and maybe not just specific imaging for nurses"
